- what's expected of a new Christian.


As they follow Jesus, leaving their old life behind and go into their new life, we can give them some truths on their walk with Jesus.

Session 2

Water Baptism



We believe in Water Baptism by full immersion

For we died and were buried with Christ by baptism. And just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glorious power of the Father, now we also may live new lives. Since we have been united with him in his death, we will also be raised to life as he was. We know that our old sinful selves were crucified with Christ so that sin might lose its power in our lives. We are no longer slaves to sin. Romans 6:4-6

The Bible makes it very clear that baptism is not optional. Jesus himself was baptized. He did not need to repent of sin, because he was without sin. However, he set an example for us to follow.



HOW DO WE DO IT?

Water baptism or baptism by immersion is also called the believer's baptism. Before a person is baptized he must first have repented of his sins and believed in the Lord Jesus Christ. This is very clear.

Baptism speaks of the death, burial and resurrection of Jesus Christ. When we follow the Lord's command to be baptized we identify with Him in this way. When you accept Jesus Christ as your Savior your sins are forgiven. He became dead to your past life. Baptism signifies death. The water in which you are immersed is like a grave and indicates that you are buried with Christ. As you rise from the water you testify that you are a new creation, rising into newness of life in Jesus Christ. And we now publicly declare our allegiance to Jesus Christ, His body the church, and all spiritual beings by this act of being placed underwater. And as a new creation you are now saying "I am a follower of Jesus Christ," telling the world.

TESTIMONY: SHARE HOW YOU WERE BAPTISED IN THE HOLY SPIRIT

On one occasion, while he was eating with them, he gave them this command:

“Do not leave Jerusalem but wait for the gift my Father promised, which you have heard me speak about.

For John baptized with water, but in a few days you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit.”

Acts 1:4–5


Acts 1:8

Baptism in the Holy Spirit is an experience that occurs following conversion. Jesus “baptizes” us in the Holy Spirit so that we are saturated, soaked, filled, and overflowing with the Holy Spirit.

When this happens, we are given gifts.

The gifts are not for us; they are for building and equipping the church.

We are also given the gift of speaking in tongues, which allows us to speak directly to God in spiritual languages unknown to us.



How do I read the bible?

Start in the gospels.

Start with the Book of Mark. It is impactful, it is short, and it gets into the accounts of what Jesus was doing. Read the Book of Mark twice.

Then read John, Luke, and Matthew.

1 John is really good because it is for new Christians. It helps them understand what Christ did and their new family relationship.



Session 5

Communion



For I received from the Lord that which I also delivered to you: that the Lord Jesus on the same night in which He was betrayed took bread; and when He had given thanks, He broke it and said, "Take, eat; this is My body which is broken for you; do this in remembrance of Me."

In the same manner He also took the cup after supper, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in My blood. This do, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of Me."

For as often as you eat this bread and drink this cup, you proclaim the Lord's death till He comes. 1 Corinthians 11:23-26

When we take communion, we are remembering Jesus' sacrifice on the cross. Where He was brutally beaten for us, His blood was shed, so we can live right and be healed.

The bread and wine are tangible, visible reminders of Christ's love. Rather than simply saying "remember," Jesus gave us a reminder. Just as we depend on food and drink to live physically, we can only live spiritually through Christ.

Communion is a time of just that: communing.

Prayer



Talking to God

Prayer is talking with God. Just as we cannot get to know people unless we talk with them, it's the same with God. God is interested in every part of our lives, and when we talk to Him, and listen to Him, we get to know Him better. In our prayers, we can praise Him, worship Him, and thank Him for His goodness and graciousness. We can also bring our needs to Him, talk to Him about our failures and the challenges we face, and pray for our friends and families.

Some people hesitate to come to God when they have problems because they feel that the only time they think of Him is when we are in trouble. However, turning to God in a time of need is often the start of a new relationship with God, one in which we come to Him in praise, adoration and worship for all He has done and all that He is. In fact, God encourages us to pray and spend time with Him.

Pray the Lord's Prayer

Pray like this:

Our Father in heaven, may your name be kept holy.

May your Kingdom come soon. May your will be done on earth, as it is in heaven.

Give us today the food we need, and forgive us our sins, as we have forgiven those who sin against us.

And don't let us yield to temptation, but rescue us from the evil one.

If you forgive those who sin against you, your heavenly Father will forgive you. But if you refuse to forgive others, your Father will not forgive your sins.



He personally carried our sins in his body on the cross so that we can be dead to sin and live for what is right. By his wounds you are healed. 1 Peter 2:24


Jesus personally carried your sins on the cross where Jesus was beaten and crucified, so we could live free from sin, and be healed by His wounds. Approximately 2/3 of Jesus' ministry was a healing ministry.

Over and over again in the New Testament we read of accounts in which Jesus healed people and restored them to wholeness and full health.

God wants his people to be well. He made a Covenant with his chosen people in Exodus and this covenant is for you too.

He said, "If you will listen carefully to the voice of the Lord your God and do what is right in his sight, obeying his commands and keeping all his decrees, then I will not make you suffer any of the diseases I sent on the Egyptians; for I am the Lord who heals you.

Have each group pray for one another's healing.


Teach and encourage others to pray in this time.
